

Purcahse Banana Pi to run rPlay

We will release an Android version of rPlay for Banana Pi.

Banana Pi is much more powerful than Raspberry Pi, most importantly it runs Android (4.4) very smoothly.

The biggest issue with Raspberry Pi is that its cpu is very slow, and can NOT run Google Chrome browser, so full support of Chromecast is not possible, as Chromecast requires Chrome browser, the Raspberry Pi version of rPlay only has limited support of YouTube, a tiny portion of Chromecast.

Now with Banana Pi, we can support everything, AirPlay, AirPlay mirroring, and full Chromecast, in addition, Miracast working very well on Banana Pi.

So, I highly recommend buying a Banana Pi, instead of Raspberry Pi.

ODROID U3 support Android 4.4.4 and it has hardware decoding. The CPU is the same as Samsung S3, and it has 2 Gb of ram. So I suppose it will work with rplay for android

If it's S3 compatible, then no problem. We tested rPlay on S3 with Android 4.1.1, working very well.

rDisplay works too, so you can actually cast the screen (audio/video) from the board to a PC, for example, then remote control the board using pc mouse and keyboard. This way, the board can be headless, easier for development.

We've been working fully on the Android version of rPlay, will release a version this month for sure.

The Banana Pi is great in supporting rPlay, Chromecast works well too on this device.

I am using Android 4.4 provided from <http://www.bananapi.com>, in theory, 4.2.2 should be OK too.
BananaPi.com has internal Android 4.4, which is what we are using to port rPlay to Banana Pi.

Yes, to provide a device with rPlay pre-installed that can mirror iOS/Android/Windows/Mac is our goal, also the reason why we are working with hardware vendors.

Android 4.4 is chosen because it contains hardware Encoders, instead of decoders. With hw encoder, one can record anything played on the box too, instead of decoding the airplay streams from other devices.
